

How do I do in-text citations to document my sources?

1. Book with author or editor: **(Daniel 1289)**. **period goes AFTER!**

****Include author or editor's last name & page number. NO COMMA!!**

For sources from the internet, include in the text the first item that appears in the Works Cited entry that corresponds to the citation (author name or article title or website name). So if no author, go to abbreviated title name in "quotes." If no article title, use the title of the homepage in *italics*) Don't boldface the citations in your paper!

***Let EasyBib be your guide! After creating the citation in EasyBib, you will use whatever comes FIRST in the citation. Always, Always, Always look for an author.**

2. WEB ARTICLE with an author or editor: **(Levy)**. **just the author!**

WEB Article with TWO authors **(Levy and Smith)**.

3. WEB ARTICLE with no author: **("Life in the 1990s")**. **article title!**

4. WEB site with no article title & no author (***Behind the Name***). **website!**

5. WEB PAGE ARTICLE with section headings: **(use title of site)**
(*dMarie Time Capsule, 1996 Prices*).

****USE COMMA to separate web page name and section name!**

6. Newspaper Source from Newsbank or *Argus Leader* **with an author:**
(O'Donnell 3D).

****include the section and page #**

7. Newspaper Source from Newsbank or *Argus* **with NO author:**
("Federal debt rises" 1A).

8. Magazine article with author and pg. numbers
(Smith 6).

9. Magazine article with no author (use shortened title of work and a pg. #)
("Impact of Global Warming" 6).

10. Article in a PDF (includes page numbers from actual article)
(Thomas 23-24).
