

Pronoun Agreement is the same as Subject Verb Agreement. Just as you make the verb agree with the subject, you make the pronoun agree with its subject.

Subject pronouns: I, he, she we, they (use at beginning of sent)

Object pronouns: me, him, her, us, them (use after active verb)

**\*\*Read each pronoun separately with the sentence!**

If subject is singular, use singular pronouns---I, me, he, she,

Each one of us has HIS ticket.

If subject is plural, use plural pronouns--we, us, them

Both of them have THEIR tickets.

After a preposition (for, by, after, except, between, in, on) use

OBJECT pronouns. **Just between you and ME (not I)**

**\*\*One rule you HAVE to memorize:**

-If the sentence has a **BE** verb (is, are, was, were, been), you must use the SUBJECT case pronoun after it. (I he she we they)

Is Karin there? This is her! NO! It's me! NO! **This is SHE** It is I.

This **is** he. This **is** she. It **was** she/we who helped him.

It **was** they who picked us up. It **was** he who called me.

It **could have been** they we saw at the concert.

It was they **NOT THEM** who visited the museum.

**Closer subject rule:**

-Neither the dog nor the cats **know** where **its/their** food is.

Neither the cats nor the dog knows where **its/their** food is.

-Remember to complete comparisons. She is smarter **than I**. (am). **NOT** She is smarter than me.

-Remember that the pronouns **IT, THIS & WHICH** should be avoided or must have a noun next to them for reference!
