Four Semicolon Constructions to learn

1. Sentence; sentence. Use the semicolon to join closely related sentences.

This is English class; we study grammar.

This is English class we study grammar. (run on sentence)
This is English class, we study grammar. (comma splice=need something stronger than a comma, so use a semicolon)

2. Sentence; hence, sentence.
however, sentence.
therefore, sentence.
thus, sentence.
as a result, sentence.
instead, sentence.
consequently, sentence.

This is English class; thus, we study grammar.

3. Sentence with city, state; city, state; and city, state.

Students study grammar and punctuation in Hartford, SD; Hartford, CT; and Hartford, AZ.

4. Phrase/Clause, sentence; phrase/clause, sentence. If 2 related sentences side by side have commas in them, use a

semicolon to separate them.

In English class, we study grammar rules; in math class, we study equations.
